ABOUT THE COURSE

PART 1: Supervision Tools—Everything You Need to Know to Become a Clinical Supervisor

This course addresses the skills and strategies needed to become a clinical supervisor, including practical suggestions for different supervision scenarios and cultural responsiveness to both students and patients. We will: 1) identify strategies to help you become a successful clinical educator/supervisor; 2) discuss tools that will enhance student clinical success; and 3) identify strategies to develop reflective student clinicians. *(0.2 ASHA CEUs, Introductory Level, Related Area)*

PART 2: Ethics for Clinical Supervisors

This course presents ethical dilemmas a therapist may encounter, including confidentiality concerns, billing, patient abandonment, conflict of interests, and employment concerns. We will discuss the best interest of the patient standard, and using case studies, we'll discuss how ethical issues could be avoided. We will: 1) Identify, examine, and discuss solutions for potential ethical concerns; 2) describe the purpose of ASHA's code of ethics in decision making; and 3) apply strategies for determining possible ethical dilemmas and determine an appropriate legal solution. *(0.1 ASHA CEUs, Introductory Level, Related Area)*
